- 2. Why did Mississippi and Alabama have fewer formal Jim Crow laws than other states in the South?
- 3. In what ways did black and white lives overlap in Alabama in the 1930s? In what ways were they completely separated?
- 4. What was the effect of the Depression on the relationships between whites and blacks in the Jim Crow South? Why?
- 5. What were some of the unwritten rules of segregation? What were some of the complications around those rules?
- 6. How were gender roles different between white and black Americans?
- 7. What were the consequences of questioning Jim Crow? How do you think they were different for blacks and whites?
- 8. How did this video help shed light on written and unwritten rules of life in Maycomb? What characters, choices, and events in the book so far did this video help you better understand?
